Correct. False! Generating ideas for paper topics is only a small slice of a scholarly publishing project. You'll also need to stay abreast of developments in your field, research which journals are most appropriate for your work, adopt appropriate citation and paper formatting, manage a growing bibliography of resources, and become familiar with changing models of publishing that have an impact on your work!

3. "Open Access" publishing refers to:

- Internet-based access to scholarly research and publications, in which work is free of most copyright restrictions
- Journals made available through databases, accessible online via subscription
- Faculty web sites that include full-text reproductions of their published works
- Removal of the institutional firewall

Correct. Open Access can be defined as free access to full-text, online, scholarly and scientific information without most copyright and licensing restrictions.

4. Open access journals cover their costs by:

- Donations from wealthy patrons
- Sales of printed copies in university bookstores
- Author fees and sponsorships from universities and professional societies
- Google adwords

Correct. Open access (OA) journals charge authors to print their work – fees ranging from \$500 to \$1,500. Sometimes institutions cover these fees.

5. What phrase best completes this sentence?: Collaborative and multi-author papers are common in scholarly publishing...

- ... and they are much easier to write than individually authored papers.
- ... but they require teamwork and individual responsibility.
- ... because you can get publishing credit without having to contribute at all to the project.

Correct. Collaborative papers may be more difficult than individually authored papers, because you have to handle many opinions and ideas, and manageUn group research, writing and revision. All authors listed on the paper should have contributed significant intellectual capital to the project to earn their credit. Collaborative projects require teamwork and individual responsibility, but they can be extremely rewarding, professionally and personally.
